What is the PDMP?

The Georgia Prescription Drug Monitoring Program (PDMP) is an electronic database used to monitor the prescribing and dispensing of controlled substances. *The purpose of the PDMP* shall be to assist in the reduction of the abuse of controlled substances; to improve, enhance, and encourage a better quality of health care by promoting the proper use of medications to treat pain and terminal illness; to reduce duplicative prescribing and overprescribing of controlled substance practices for health oversight purposes; and to gather data for epidemiological research. Part 2 Section 16-13-57

What is the PDMP

The PDMP is a database that <u>shows the details of every prescription</u> <u>drug order that has been filled in Georgia, organized by patient</u>. A person authorized to access the PDMP can look up a particular person and see that person's entire prescription history for the previous two years. The prescription information in the PDMP is kept current – it will display information on a prescription filled within the last twenty-four hours. The PDMP displays information on all Schedule II – V prescriptions.

The PDMP is accessed through an online portal that requires an approved user name and password.

GA PDMP Legislative Mandates (2017)

Before House Bill 249

- Established in 2011 by GA Legislature
- Purpose of PDMP
 - Reduce abuse of controlled substances
 - Ensure legitimate use of controlled substances to treat pain and terminal illness
 - Reduce duplicative prescribing and overprescribing
- Georgia licensed dispensers required to submit information for Schedule II, III, IV, and V controlled substance prescriptions weekly

After House Bill 249

- July 1, 2017 DPH begins administration of Prescription Drug Monitoring Program (PDMP)
- July 1, 2017- Dispensers required to enter prescription information into PDMP within 24 hours of dispensing controlled substance
- January 1, 2018 Mandatory that all Prescribers register in the PDMP
- July 1, 2018 Prescribers required to check PDMP for any patient prior to prescribing opiates or cocaine derivatives in Schedule II drugs or benzodiazepines

GA PDMP Legislative Mandates (2018)

Before SB 407

Delegates required to register with GA Pharmacy Board and with the GA PDMP

Cannot share PDMP Data with more States- currently share with AL, SC, MA & ND

Cannot share PDMP Data with Law Enforcement Officers outside of the state of GA

Not able to share PDMP data with Provider Networks

After SB 407

When signed by Governor: PDMP only

When signed by Governor: Will be able to share with any State

When signed by Governor: Will be able to share

When signed by Governor: Will be able to share with Provider Networks Integration Funding?

Registration Requirements

When: By January 1, 2018

Who: Prescribers with active DEA numbers and are licensed in Georgia (Code Section 16-13-57)

Medical Doctors Physician Assistants Nurse Practitioners Optometrists Dentists Podiatrists Note: Prescribers who attain a DEA Registration after

such date shall enroll within 30 days of attaining such credentials (16-18-57-c)

Legislative Mandates – Code References

16-13-63 (2)(A) – On and after **July 1, 2018** when a prescriber is prescribing a controlled substance listed in paragraph (1) or (2) of Code Section 16-13-26 or benzodiazepines, he or she shall seek and review information from the PDMP the first time he or she issues such prescription to a patient and thereafter at least once every 90 days, unless...

Exemptions from checking include:

1. Prescriptions for no more than 3 days of a covered substance and no more than 26 pills

2. The patient is in a hospital or health care facility, etc., where prescriptions are administered and used by a patient on the premises of the facility

3. Patient has had outpatient surgery and the prescription is for no more than a 10 day supply and no more than 40 pills

4. Patient is terminally ill or under supervised care of an outpatient hospice program; or

5. Patient is receiving treatment for cancer

Dear Health Care Provider

I am writing as your Commissioner to remind you about a critical deadline that is fast approaching for preacribers to register in the Prescription Drug Monitoring Program (PDMP). All prescribers are required by Georgia law to register in the PDMP by Jan. 1, 2018. Currently only about 50 percent of prescribers in Georgia are registered in the PDMP.

As you may recall, the Georgia General Assembly passed House Bill 249 during the 2017 legislative session. The legislation provided for several changes to the PDMP.

 Effective July 1, 2017, dispensers are required to enter prescription information for Schedule II, III, IV, V controlled substances within 24 hours. This provides prescribers more efficient access to information with less wait time as they make the best clinical decisions pessible in the statement of the set of the NOVEMBER 2017 NON TUE WED THU FRI SAT 1 2 3 4

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How to Use the PDMP?

Quick Reference Guide – Making a Request in PMP AWAR_XE

- Go to the PMP AWAR_xE login page (<u>https://georgia.pmpaware.net/login</u>). If a password reset is needed, use the "Reset Password" link.
- 2. Once you're logged in, select the RxSearch tab, then choose Patient Request.

3. Enter search criteria.

At a minimum, you must provide:

- First name (full or partial*)
- Last name (full or partial*)
- Date of birth (must be in MM/DD/YYYY format)
- Prescription fill dates (must be in MM/DD/YYYY format)
- Click Search at the bottom of the screen to submit your request.
- 5. Matching patient history will now display. If multiple patients are identified, you will be presented with the option to refine your search by providing additional search information or you can select a single, multiple, or all returned patient groups to include in your patient prescription request results.
- Click on "Run Report", the patient prescription results will be displayed.
- Print form by clicking on the PDF button or convert the form to a CSV (Microsoft Excel) file. You may retrieve your searches and the search results of any delegates by clicking on the Requests History tab.

Search Tips:

 *Partial Spelling: Using Partial Spelling can be helpful for hyphenated or commonly abbreviated names (Will vs. William). At a minimum, enter the first three characters of the patient's first and/or last name.

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- Prescription Fill Dates The maximum time period for your search is 60 months.
- PMP Interconnect Search allows you to search other participating state databases for the patient's records.
 - To improve the likelihood of finding a specific patient:
- For out-of-state searches Limit your search criteria to only the required fields.
- For in-state searches In addition to the required fields, include additional details such as ZIP code.

PDMP Delegates

- HB 249 / 16-13-60(5)(A) Provides guidance on Delegate use of the PDMP
 - Not more than two individuals who are members per shift or rotation of the prescriber's or dispenser's staff or employed at the health care facility in which prescriber is practicing
- 2018 SB407 Change for Delegates
 - Will not be required to register with the Board of Pharmacy
- DPH Rules and Regulations for Delegates
 - Available on the DPH Website and attached to the PDMP Delegate Role when registering
- As a Prescriber you will need to:
 - 1. Electronically approve the Delegate registration in the PDMP as supervisor
 - 2. Sign the signature page of the rules and regulations indicating that you have ensured that your delegate has read the information and understand the requirements. The Delegate Responsibility Statement Sheet must be uploaded into the PDMP with the Delegate Registration

National PDMP's

With the exception of Missouri (50 of 115 counties) every state has a statewide PDMP Appriss Health provides the platform for 42 of 52 PDMP's in the US



PDMP Improvements

- Implemented Clinical Alerts
 - Number of prescribers and dispensers over a period of time (5/5/90)
 - Active opioid and benzodiazepine prescription at the same time
- 2018 Legislation SB407
 - Simplifies delegate registration
 - Allows DPH to share pdmp information in the PDMP with other States
 - Allows DPH to share pdmp information in the PDMP with law enforcement from other states
 - Allows DPH to share pdmp information in the PDMP with electronic health records
- "How To" training video and written instructions for prescribers
- "Understanding Your Responsibilities" for Delegates
- System test for reliability
- Ongoing outreach
- PDMP Annual Report with deidentified data for 2016 and 2017 "Summer of 2018"
- 16-13-57(d) Mandatory first Check July 1, 2018
